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BACKGROUND

Few changes in age gap between coresidential partners, despite growing diversity in coresidential couples.^{1, 2, 3}

Couples who differ on one characteristic (such as age, race, or education) tend to also be heterogamous on other dimensions.^{4, 5}

Type of coresidential couple may also influence the age gap between partners:⁶

• In 2021, more married spouses had a partner within 3 years of their age than cohabiters.^{2, 3}

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

- **RQ1:** How does the age gap between partners differ for opposite-sex, same-sex male, and same-sex female cohabiting and married couples?
- **RQ2:** Are differences in the age gap between partners across couple type accounted for by sociodemographic characteristics of couples?
- **RQ3:** Is the association between sociodemographic characteristics and partners' age gap similar for cohabiting and married couples?

DATA AND METHODS

2021 1-year American Community Survey

- <u>Sample</u>: Couples identified using the relationship to reference person question.
- Focal Independent Variable: Couple type (opposite-sex married, male-male married, female-female married, opposite-sex cohabiting, male-male cohabiting, female-female cohabiting).
- <u>Dependent Variable</u>: Age gap between partners (absolute value of age difference between partners).
- Control Variables: Sociodemographic factors associated with the age gap of cohabiting and married couples.

Age Differences Among Coresidential Partners



Type Associated With I	Partners' Age Gap?	
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Cohabiting vs. married couples:

- The mean age gap of opposite-sex cohabiters and women in samesex cohabitations significantly differed from the gap for oppositesex married spouses and femalefemale spouses, respectively.
- This was not the case for men in a same-sex union; the age gap for men cohabiting with men did not significantly differ from the age gap of male-male married couples.

SUMMARY

RQ1: On average, the age gap for men with a same-sex cohabiting/spouse is larger than the gap for those with an opposite-sex partner/spouse and women in a same-sex union.

• Grouping men and women in a same-sex union into one group obscures differences in the experiences and characteristics of men and women in a same-sex coresidential union.

RQ2: Differences in partners' age gap persist after accounting for a range of sociodemographic characteristics and couple homogamy indicators.

• Other dimensions of homogamy do not appear to account for age differences.

RQ3: Factors associated with the age gap for cohabiters were not associated with the age gap between spouses in the same fashion.

• There continue to be key differences between cohabiters and married couples.

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
