- As we prepare for the 2030 Census, an important part of our efforts includes seeking out and listening to diverse voices. That certainly includes listening to our partners and stakeholders, which of course includes you.
- We're confident that by working together, we can better meet your needs and produce useful statistics about the Hispanic population.
- Today, I have colleagues from our Population Division, Roberto Ramirez and Merarys Rios, to help answer your questions.
